[Jesus told his disciples this parable: "A man going on a journey called in his servants and entrusted his possessions to them. To one he gave five talents; to another, two; to a third, one-- to each according to his ability. Then he went away.] Immediately the one who received five talents went and traded with them, and made another five. Likewise, the one who received two made another two. But the man who received one went off and dug a hole in the ground and buried his master's money.

["After a long time the master of those servants came back and settled accounts with them. The one who had received five talents came forward bringing the additional five. He said, 'Master, you gave me five talents. See, I have made five more.' His master said to him, 'Well done, my good and faithful servant. Since you were faithful in small matters, I will give you great responsibilities. Come, share your master's joy.'] Then the one who had received two talents also came forward and said, 'Master, you gave me two talents. See, I have made two more.' His master said to him, 'Well done, my good and faithful servant. Since you were faithful in small matters, I will give you great responsibilities. Come, share your master's joy.' Then the one who had received the one talent came forward and said, 'Master, I knew you were a demanding person, harvesting where you did not plant and gathering where you did not scatter; so out of fear I went off and buried your talent in the ground. Here it is back.' His master said to him in reply, 'You wicked, lazy servant! So you knew that I harvest where I did not plant and gather where I did not scatter? Should you not then have put my money in the bank so that I could have got it back with interest on my return? Now then! Take the talent from him and give it to the one with ten. For to everyone who has, more will be given and he will grow rich; but from the one who has not, even what he has will be taken away. And throw this useless servant into the darkness outside, where there will be wailing and grinding of teeth." The Gospel of the Lord. R. Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

Homily

Profession of Faith

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of Heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. R. Lord, I am not worthy that You should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed.


Communion Antiphon: Matthew 25:20-21

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Praying with the Scriptures

One form of praying with the scripture can be remembered with the acronym: ARRR—Acknowledge, Relate, Receive, Respond. This form of prayer helps us to make our prayer more relational. Prayer is a relationship of persons. These four parts of relational prayer are not rigid steps, but rather flow together. Choose a passage from the Bible (you could use the Gospel reading found in this worship aide). Read it slowly a few times.

Acknowledge: Begin prayer by acknowledging the real presence of God who is always beholding us. As I begin my prayer, what is in His eyes as I look at Him? I also acknowledge what is on my heart as I come to prayer. A deepening relationship is a more and more honest exchange of hearts. How am I feeling; what am I bringing to prayer? What word or phrase drew my attention in the passage of scripture for this time of prayer?

Relate: Rather than thinking "about" God, I begin to speak to Him directly about what is in my heart. Nothing is off limits with Him. I do not hold back speaking to Him about my worries, sadness, anger, joy, fear, whatever is honestly there. I tell the Lord, in as much detail as possible, what I've just acknowledged within myself. I relate everything to Him as I would a close friend. The exercise of expressing in words what is happening in my heart is very helpful and healing—Jesus desires this for me. Perhaps I write in a journal.

Receive: I take time to listen to Him. I believe He wants to speak to me. Sometimes He will reveal His voice through a word, a song that runs through my head, a memory, a sensation in my body, a Scripture passage or phrase. I wait for Him. I receive His gaze and

the words of His truth for me. I resist the temptation to shrink away from the silence because of fear or desire to control the relationship. Learning to wait on His answer in a place of uncertainty is the real stuff of growing in relationship with Him. This will take time, practice, and growing trust.

Respond: I take this opportunity to respond to what I have received from God. It can be more conversation, a question, a "yes," tears, joy, gratitude, etc. I may make a resolution for the week ahead. I may write down what I have received in this time of prayer. The process of writing down make the gift more concrete, hence God told Habakkuk: "Write down the vision, clearly upon tablets so that one can read it readily." (Hab 2: 2) A month (or even year) of these prayer experiences written down can become an arsenal of protection for future battles.
